Joe Bachicha says there are two things he could not do without: his Meals on Wheels Central Texas food deliveries and the company of his dog Mini Lou, or "Miss Lou" as he calls her. Mini Lou came to Joe through the shelter system after his previous dog passed. With Mini Lou, he continues to use the services through the MOWCTX PALS (Pets Assisting the Lives of Seniors) program to cover her annual vet visits and heartworm and flea medication. Because Joe is homebound. Mini Lou

is an inside dog that sits on his lap or wakes him in the morning by putting her head on his chest. On the rare occasion that Joe leaves the house, he says Mini Lou is there upon his return, "waiting with her favorite toy."

Joe became a client of MOWCTX when his late wife developed Alzheimer's and could no longer prepare dinner for them. "I never learned to cook," says Joe. "I can make salad and pancakes, that's about all." He likes all the dish-

Ask Larry Henson why he devoted his professional life to helping others and he gives his mom all of the credit: "My mother would always do things for people...like food out of our garden. She just had a big heart for giving." The apple didn't fall far from the tree, which is how Mr. Henson wound up studying social work at The University of Texas. After college, he spent several years working with children in the Texas foster care system

But serious health issues brought his career to an abrupt halt. These days, he lives with congestive heart failure and diabetes. Severe arthritis in both knees and one of his hands makes cooking for himself extremely challenging. When his health first declined, a friend suggested Meals on Wheels Central Texas. "I think that was the best idea I ever heard," Mr. Henson recalls with a laugh. He depends on

our lunches to maintain his health. "The food they bring is nutritious. It gives me great joy."

He appreciates as well the folks who bring the meals to his North Austin apartment. And he's happy we are resuming daily meal service in January. "I have some of the sweetest volunteers who deliver to me. It's going to be great. It will be so exciting."

MOWCTX also provides Mr. Henson with monthly supplies of shelf stable groceries through the HOPE (Healthy Options Program for the Elderly) program, our collaboration with the Central Texas Food Bank. "It helps me stretch my food," he says of the extra assistance. And he credits MOWCTX with helping him to continue to live independently and with dignity. "I don't have to worry. They've got mv back."





"MOM IS SO EXCITED"

For many folks in Maria Arzola's situation, the thought of owning a home would be a pie in the sky fantasy. It was the early 1970's and Ms. Arzola, recently widowed, faced the prospect of raising her three children alone while living in public housing. But, against all odds, Ms. Arzola achieved her dream of home ownership thanks in large part to pie.

You see, Ms. Arzola worked at Bruce Pie Company for nearly 30 years. Between her job there, actually making the pies, and the one her daughter, Vangie, got after graduating from high school, they saved enough money to buy a modest home in East Austin.

Now 92-years-old, Ms. Arzola still lives there and takes great pride in it. "She's kept that house spotless," says her daughter, Mary Ann. But sometimes Ms. Arzola needs a little help. Recently, her old gas range gave out. The Meals on Wheels Central Texas Home Repair program replaced the appliance with a brand new gas range and matching range hood.

The new stove really helps Ms. Arzola maintain her independence in the home she worked so tirelessly to buy nearly 50 years ago. "Mom is so excited," Mary Ann says. "She has a lot of memories in that house."

Vietnam veteran Mike Prosser served our nation for 17 years in the United States Marine Corps.

Now 71-years-old, he and his wife, Claire, enjoy retirement in Burnet, Texas where they bought their home in 2007. "We're happy here," Claire Prosser says. In recent years, though, problems with the house began to pop up - some of which threatened the couple's safety. For one thing, Mr. Prosser was having trouble getting in and out of the bathtub.

They turned to the Meals on Wheels Central Texas (MOWCTX) Home Repair program for help. Using funds generously donated by The Home Depot Foundation, MOWCTX removed the bathtub and replaced it with a walk-in shower. Workers also installed new kitchen cabinets and counters, a new sink, and brand new appliances. They even built a doggy door for the Prossers' dogs, Ringo, Piper and Emmy, to use.

The couple is thrilled with the finished product and very grateful for the help. "It really saved us a lot. It would have taken us years to save up to pay for this," Claire Prosser says of the renovations. "I tell everybody who asks that Meals on Wheels Central Texas and The Home Depot Foundation did all of this."
