In her younger days, Ms. McKay worked hard in such varied jobs as hotel manager; running a group home for boys; and teaching at Job Corps, a free education and training program for young people. She also volunteered for Prison Fellowship. a global outreach program for inmates and their families. There's no doubt Ms. McKav's brain still runs full steam ahead these days: her
